



Thank you for visiting the second virtual exhibition about our plans for the development of a new energy recovery facility (ERF) at Overwood Farm, on the Dovesdale Complex.

Since announcing our proposals in early February, we have been undertaking a range of technical assessments in the local area to inform our proposal that will be submitted to South Lanarkshire Council. In light of these assessments, we are hosting this second virtual exhibition to provide you with more detailed information about our plans.

Our first virtual public exhibition provided introductory information about Viridor, the ERF Process, the Proposal Site and the role of the Scottish Environmental Protection Agency (SEPA) in regulating the facility. 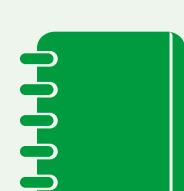
Had over 350 unique visitors to the first virtual exhibition
